"For unto us a child is born?"



## "Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favour rests."

## Luke 2:13-14

As we look forward to this wonderful time of celebration, are we aware that it was foretold in the book of Genesis? It wasn't a sudden inspiration on the part of God, but part of his plan for the redemption of humanity.

It is common to think of the Old and New Testaments as being separate, but a study of scripture presents a different picture. In relation to the coming of Jesus, there is a continuous link of scriptures which provide confirmation as to the truth of God's word.

## Read Genesis 1:26-31, 3:1-15, Matthew 1:18-25 and Galatians 4:4

God created man (both male and female), in his own image and longed to have fellowship with them. He provided for their every need with only one stipulation: that they should not eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

• Note verse 15 in particular. Now look at Matthew 1:20 and Galatians 4:4. What do you understand by these verses?

It would take far more time than we have in this session to look at all the prophecies in the Old Testament which were confirmed by events in the New, but we will look at a selection of them.

"It has been calculated that the chance of this event was one in 300,000.

"If one were to conceive 50 specific prophecies about a person in the future, whom one would never meet, just what's the likelihood that this person will fulfil all 50 of the predictions? How much less would this likelihood be if 25 of these predictions were about what other people would do to him, and were completely beyond his control?

"After examining only eight different prophecies, they conservatively estimated that the chance of one man fulfilling all eight prophecies was one in 10^17. To illustrate how large the number  $10^{17}$  is (a figure with 17 zeros), the professor gave this illustration: If you mark one of ten tickets, and place all the tickets in a hat, and thoroughly stir them, and then ask a blindfolded man to draw one, his chance of getting the right ticket is one in ten. Suppose that we take 10^17 silver dollars and lay them on the face of Texas. They'll cover all of the state two feet deep. Now mark one of these silver dollars and stir the whole mass thoroughly, all over the state. Blindfold a man and tell him that he can travel as far as he wishes, but he must pick up the one silver dollar that has the special mark on it. What chance would he have of getting the right one? Just the same chance that the prophets would've had of writing these eight prophecies and having them all come true in any one man, from their day to the present time." This information comes from: *Empower International* I know this may sound complex, but it is important that we realise that in effect, it is impossible for the prophecies concerning the birth, life, and death of Jesus, to have happened by chance.

In our recent studies, we have been looking at the line of succession from Abraham, through Isaac and Jacob, and to David. Here is what the Bible tells us.
